POST FIGHT RESULTS & WRAP UP**

**Fan Favorites Zahir “King” Raheem & Paul “The Truth” Delgado Take Care of Business  
Evander Holyfield is Honored and Former Olympic Teammates Come to Support  
Eleven Standing Still Played to a Packed Hard Rock Café Crowd**

**ATLANTA, GA.** The Big Rock Out 3, a Vegas style professional boxing series and rock concert was held on Friday, August 27th, 2010 at the luxurious Westin Peachtree Plaza hotel in the heart of downtown Atlanta, GA. Promoted by Sports Fan Properties, Zahir “King” Raheem and Paul “The Truth” Delgado dazzled their hometown crowd with an excellent exhibition of flash and power. The Big Rock Out also honored boxing great, Evander “The Real Deal” Holyfield by inducting him into their “Ring of Honor”. Evander’s Olympic teammates medalists; Virgil Hill, Tyrell Biggs and Henry Tillman were also on hand as special guests to take part in the Ring of Honor ceremony.

“It was a very special evening that any level of boxing fan could truly appreciate”, said Greg Barckhoff, promoter of The Big Rock Out. “The 1984 US Olympic team is considered by many to be one of the best Olympic boxing teams of all time and we were very luck to have four prominent members of that team with us on Friday night.”

More than 1,000 fans packed the Peachtree Ballroom at the Westin Peachtree Plaza and they were treated with six (6) professional bouts, headlined by former WBC International lightweight champ Zahir Raheem (31-3 18KO) who was pitted against cagey Mexican veteran Roberto Valenzuela (53-54 43KO). “King” Raheem made a spectacular ring entrance that feature Atlanta’s own Yung Joc singing his hit song, “It’s Going Down”. Raheem took his entrance momentum to the ring and immediately started using angles and fancy footwork to land hard combination blows that appeared to be too fast for Valenzuela. Raheem continued with his body attack and capitalized with a left hook to the head at the end of round one.

Raheem continued to work to the body in round two and set up clear shots to the head. With about ten seconds left in the round Raheem landed another perfect one-two combo that landed square on Valenzuela’s chin. Valenzuela attempted to get up at the count of nine, but wobbled backwards forcing the referee to stop the contest at 2:56 of round two.

In the co-main event, Paul “The Truth” Delgado (24-9-1) used his patented brilliant boxing style to outwork Chad Greenleaf of West Virginia in the first five spirited rounds. However, Greenleaf came out strong in the sixth and attempted to score a miraculous come from behind win. Greenleaf landed three straight right hands that rattled Delgado. Delgado rode it out and then landed a big time looping right hand that dropped Greenleaf in the corner. Greenleaf manage to get to his feet at the count of nine with only a few seconds left in the bout. All three judges unanimously scored it for Delgado 60-53 twice, 64-54
